European Partnerships – what and why

European Partnerships are strategic instruments which enable long-term collaborations between the Union and public and/or private partners to tackle common challenges through the co-design and implementation of joint R&I programmes







STRATEGIC ORIENTATION

Foster directionality of funding in line with EU policy priorities

CREATING CRITICAL MASS

- Avoid fragmentation and duplication of R&I efforts
- Achieve greater scale and impact

FOSTERING ECOSYSTEMS

- Integrated value chains and ecosysems
- Integrative activities outside of funding





New approach under Horizon Europe

New generation of objective-driven and more ambitious partnerships in support of agreed EU policy objectives

Key Features

- Strategic orientation
- Simple architecture and toolbox
- Common set of criteria for the entire life-cycle (<u>Horizon</u> <u>Europe regulation</u> Article 10 and Annex III)

CO-PROGRAMMED

Based on Memoranda of Understanding/contractual arrangements; implemented independently by the partners and by Horizon Europe

CO-FUNDED

Based on a joint programme agreed and implemented by partners; commitment of partners for financial contributions and additional activities

INSTITUTIONALISED

Based on long-term dimension and need for high integration; partnerships based on Art 185/187 of TFEU and the EIT legal acts for 2021-2027

Selection and lifecycle criteria

The Horizon Europe Regulation's Annex III establishes a number of selection and lifecycle criteria:

- More effectiveness and EU added value
- Interest and ex-ante commitments from potential partners
- Coherence and synergies
- Transparency and openness
- Additionality and directionality
- Flexible implementation
- Leverage effect
- Time-bound, measurable expected outcomes, results and impacts
- Measures for transitioning out of FP funding



Co-programmed European Partnerships

- Most relevant previous actions: Contractual Public-Private-Partnerships (cPPP)
- **Legal form:** Memorandum of Understanding (signed between representatives of the partners and the Commission)
- Implementation:
 - Union budget is implemented through Horizon Europe work programme calls
 - Partners implement their commitments and contributions under their responsibility
 - Activities and contributions have to be agreed in the Annual Work Plan (to ensure they are in the scope of the partnership)
 - <u>European Commission</u>: call topics for the necessary range of actions (R&I, Innovation actions, CSA, prizes, etc.)
 - Partners: their own activities and investments
- Associations provides back-office with important functionalities



Co-funded European Partnerships

- Relevant previous actions: European Joint Programme and ERA-NET Co-fund
- Legal form: Grant Agreement (programme co-fund action) signed between a consortium
 of beneficiaries and the Commission
- Implementation:
 - Partners design a common programme to be implemented under their responsibility pooling national funding/resources with co-funding from the Union
 - Funding rate 30% [in justified cases up to 50%]
 - Funding based on Horizon Europe eligible costs, including financial support to third parties
 - Calls and evaluations are organised centrally, beneficiaries in selected projects are funded at national level (on the basis of rules agreed by partners)



Institutionalised Partnerships

Legal base:

- Article 185 and Article 187 of the TFEU requires the preparation and adoption of a Commission proposal (incl. ex-ante impact assessment)
- a Decision of European Parliament and Council (Art 185) / Council Regulation (Art 187, EIT)
- **Implementation** by dedicated structures created for that purpose (designated by Member States or Union body, such as Joint Undertakings)
- Rules for participation of Horizon Europe apply by default
- Specific provisions in Horizon Europe set higher requirements, e.g.:
 - Implemented only if other forms of Partnerships would not achieve the objectives, and if justified by a long-term perspective and high degree of integration
 - Central management of all financial contributions (except in duly justified cases)
 - Article 185 initiatives: Mandatory participation of at least 40% of MS
 - Financial contributions from partners other than the Union are required



How to participate in a European Partnership

Become a partner

- Co-programmed: Join the respective association
- Co-funded: Be(come) part of a successful consortium implementing a <u>co-funded partnership</u>
- Institutionalised: Rules vary depending on the partnerships' institutional set-up and their members

Participate in calls

- Co-programmed: Eligible entities that are part of a successful consortium under a call implementing a co-programmed partnership → F&T Portal (filter for co-programmed partnerships)
- Co-funded: Participation in transnational calls launched by the partnership (restricted to entities established in Member States and Associated Countries that are part of the consortia implementing the co-funded partnership) → F&T Portal (filter for cascading calls)
- Institutionalised: Participation in calls launched by institutionalised partnerships → F&T Portal





What does the future hold? (I)

Caveats:

- Discussions on FP10 are still very preliminary: no consolidated Commission position yet
- Timing of the process also not yet consolidated: formal proposal expected probably in Q2 2025, but further instructions expected only when process on MFF development will be clarified
- Important input documents still expected: Report of the High Level Group, Horizon Europe Interim Evaluation
- Engage in discussion on the basis of lessons learned so far





What does the future hold? (II)

Building blocks for reflection:

- Typology: current dichotomy between public-public and public-private, duplication of basic principles; legacy partnerships remain part of the landscape
- Selection and portfolio building: Selection criteria too qualitative, large stock of legacy partnerships, questionable evidence base, little dynamism in the landscape → Can we call a 60 partnership portfolio strategic?
- Lifecycle: exit requirements not clearly defined, no structural pipeline for newcomers
- Implementation: incoherent treatment, fragmented implementation structures, legal construction (especially regarding co-funds), high administrative burden, definition of additional activities, monitoring





- Review of areas for institutionalised European Partnerships was concluded in July 2023
- The <u>Biennial Monitoring Report 2024</u> was be published in September
- New candidate European Partnerships are under development in the context of the Strategic Plan 2025-2027 → opportunities to get involved early on
- The 2024 <u>European Partnerships Stakeholder Forum</u> is under preparation → save the date 4-5 December 2024

Type: Co-funded

Summary: Advance healthy, biodiverse and resilient forests that are sustainably managed and able to provide a wide range of key-ecosystem services, including climate change mitigation and continuing support of for the development of the bioeconomy



Innovative Materials for EU

Cluster: 4

Type: Co-programmed

Foreseen partners: Advanced Materials 2030 Initiative (AMI2030); Graphene Flagship Initiative

Summary: Research, development, and uptake of a new generation of 'safe and sustainable by design' innovative materials, fit for the circular economy and providing new uses essential for the green and digital transition

Raw Materials for the Green and Digital Transitions

Cluster: 4

Type: Co-funded

Summary: Exploration, extraction, processing, refining, and recycling of strategic raw materials (minerals and metals), efficient use of raw materials in design and production, sustainable use and reuse of products, as well as effective policy and governance



Resilient Cultural Heritage

Cluster: 2

Type: Co-funded

Summary: Strengthen research on cultural heritage to develop and promote, through dissemination and capacity building activities, innovative solutions, assessment systems, adaptation and mitigation strategies and risk management models, for transmitting cultural heritage to future generations



Social Transformations and Resilience

Cluster: 2

Type: Co-funded

Summary: Create collaborative and systematic knowledge and tools (through SSH) to enable inclusive sustainable development and social and economic resilience in the light of changes in climate, technology, demography, global trade patterns, and potential unexpected shocks

Summary: Promote the industrial engagement in PV research and innovation to support the innovation ecosystem across the full PV value chain, representing the R&I pillar of the EU Solar PV Industry Alliance



Textiles of the Future

Cluster: 4

Type: Co-programmed

Foreseen partners: EURATEX; European Technology Platform for the Future of Textiles and Clothing (Textile ETP)

Summary: Drive sustainable innovation and support research, development, and production scale-up, foster novel business models and stimulate public and private investment to create economic, technological, and societal value for businesses in the textile sector, citizens and the environment



Virtual Worlds

Cluster: 4

Type: Co-programmed

<u>Foreseen partners</u>: VR/AR Industrial Coalition, XR4Europe, New European Media (NEM) Initiative

Summary: Shape the next frontier of virtual worlds, including metaverses, based on common European values, principles and strategic interests: virtual worlds and metaverses that are open, interoperable, trustful, secure, human-centric, preserving privacy, respecting our legislation, and offering opportunities to everyone
