




Project overview



Western Balkans Mobility Scheme in a nutshell I

- Three **objectives** of the scheme:
 - Fostering <u>brain circulation</u> and <u>encourage brain retain within</u> <u>the WB</u> at an <u>early stage of the researchers</u>' careers
 - Supporting <u>excellence</u> in research in the WB
 - Promoting and increasing the <u>Open Access use of research</u> <u>infrastructure (RI)</u> across the Western Balkans
- <u>Building on previous experiences</u> (e.g. Danube Region Rectors Conference, Report International Service Facility (2021) "Researchers' Mobility in the Western Balkans")
- Aiming for sustainability through a <u>follow-up of the mobility</u> <u>scheme</u> to be funded by regional, economy-level or international stakeholders



Western Balkans Mobility Scheme in a nutshell II

- Project must cover a <u>short-term mobility</u> by young researchers (between two weeks and two months)
- <u>Use of specialised equipment or facilities</u> (research infrastructure) <u>in another WB to do research</u>
- <u>All thematic research areas</u> eligible (particular welcome: twin transition, relevant for strategies such as S3)
- Maximum 5.000 EURO per grant, eligible costs: (1) travel costs and living allowances as unit costs, (2) accession fees, consumables etc. by host institution, (3) costs for exploitation of project results (publication of scientific article, etc.)
- Project contract with the young researcher



Process and evaluation

- Promotion through Western Balkans Info Hub (<u>www.westernbalkans-infohub.eu</u>) and project partners (at least one partner in each WB)
- Robust and complex process managed by DLR
 Projektträger
- Easy to approach experts for the evaluation (thematically open, needs a broad set of evaluators to choose from)
- Slight flexibility in the selection through a Steering Group meeting



Western Balkans Mobility Scheme: First evaluation results I

- The pilot measure addressed <u>a relevant need and</u> <u>topic which is of interest for young researchers</u> in the WB (31 applications received)
- However, a good dissemination and promotion strategy is of high importance in order to reach the target group (since without a prolongation of the deadline and improved promotion activities only ten applications would have been submitted)
- Each economy provided at least three applicants, which is an <u>excellent result regarding the variety in</u> <u>number of researchers and size of innovation system</u> within the six economies.



Western Balkans Mobility Scheme: First evaluation results II

- The <u>quality of applications proved to be high</u>
 - Out of the 31 applications only one was not eligible
 - Out of the 30 applications that entered the review process, a total of 26 have been above threshold indicating their recommendation to be funded
- With 31 applications submitted and 23 projects funded the <u>success</u> <u>rate is around 74%</u>
 - This is a good rate, combining a slightly competitive approach with very strong motivating and positive signals
 - Against the background that this scheme addresses young researchers with little to no experience in competitive funding procedures it seemed to be appropriate to fund as much applicants as possible
 - With the 23 projects the budget was fully exhausted.

Summary

What has worked well?

- Building on previous schemes
- Cooperation with Rectors Conferences
- Recruiting of evaluator experts
- Cooperation with the Steering Group and selection
- Communication with the grantees

What challenges have you encountered?

- Promotion takes time, deadline had to be postponed
- Administrative issues, e.g. it was difficult to grant extensions because of the wording in the call ("lessons learned" for the project team)
- Collecting success stories

- The projects are still running, and the evaluation process will start after all projects are finished.
- Our overall impression so far is that everything went well.
